I'm reading a great book these days entitled *Tempered Resilience: How Leaders are Formed in the Crucible of Change* by Tod Bolsinger. It's one thing to read about becoming a leader; it's another thing to actually lead, and to learn and grow from such experiences.



In a similar way, it's one thing to identify as a Christian. There are plenty of books about that as well. But it's a whole other thing to live into that calling as a Christian.

One of those things we learn as followers of Christ is that we each have an important roll to play in making the church what it is today. As we celebrate our newest class of church officers beginning the new year of service, we are each reminded that God calls us into ministry as well. Yes, going to church on Sunday is important. Giving to the church through our pledges is important. But what is most exciting for me as a pastor is discovering how God uniquely calls us in our lives of faith. The Christian jargon term for this is *vocation*. Ruth Haley Barton (in *Strengthening the Soul of Your Leadership*) writes beautifully about discerning our God-given vocation in life:

"Somehow we know that this moment is different. This is not about making a brilliant career move. It is not about security. It is not about success or failure or anything else the ego wants for us. It is not about choosing among several attractive options. This is about the Spirit of God setting us on our feet and telling us, "This is yours to do.""

Old Stone Presbyterian Church is stronger when we embrace God's personal calling into ministry. It may be volunteering to serve as an usher, or it may be a calling to serve in mission on the other side of the world. It may be a calling to serve on the Personnel Committee, or it may be a calling to feed the hungry of Greenbrier County. It may be a calling to pray for this church everyday from home, or it may be a calling to help build homes for those seeking such a place to call their own. When we empower one another to lead in ministry versus relying on others to do the work of the church, we all benefit. We realize that there are so many opportunities and possibilities in our walks of faith. We realize that we are the church together.

What gifts and passions might you bring to Old Stone in the days ahead?

Where is there a need in the community that we as a church might be able to address?

How may God be calling you to serve in ministry in 2022?

Session Highlights - January 5, 2022 Stated Meeting:

After an attendance quorum was established, Tracy Morgan opened the meeting with a devotion entitled "Restart the Journey." Minutes of the previous meeting and the December congregational meeting were approved.

Stewardship and Finance Committee presented the revenue and expense budget performance for 2021: Pledges Income=\$341,093; Budgeted Income=358,706; Shortfall=\$17,613.

Unpledged giving was also down \$18,010 for a total of \$29,890 income loss. Hopefully those that did not fulfill their pledges will commit to doing that.

To date, 71 pledges have been returned in the amount of \$298,510 which is \$62,500 less than the 2021 budgeted pledges. The committee will be communicating with over 20 pledging members who have not yet responded.

Pastor Jeff's report included a plea for timely information for pastoral care concerns and a request for a February session leadership retreat. Pastoral concerns include: Death of Paul Greer, retired coach and teacher; Death of Chuck Jeffries in Romney, WV, brother of Nancy Smallenberger and Carol Bland. Dee Brown had gall bladder surgery and is recovering.

Worship attendance for Dec 5 = 102, Dec 12 = 100, Dec 19 = 101, Dec 24 = 146, Dec 26 = 39, Jan 2 = 47, Jan 9 = 33, Jan 16 = 31.

Covid-19 Reopening Task Force suggested continuing current guidelines plus suggesting members upgrade their masks to N95 and inviting people to self-report Covid positives and/or exposures.

2022 Fellowship Committee plans under the leadership of Karen Leland are off to a good start. She reported the following Fellowship activities: Jan 11 Walk & Talk, Jan 24 at 1:00 Rip & Stitch, Men's Breakfast at Shoney's second Wed of each month at 8:00. Hopefully a February addition will include Dinners for 6/8. Please contact Karen for more information or ideas.

Gwen's Meals: A Ministry of Old Stone Presbyterian Women

Gwen Clingman was a lady of small stature, but with a big, big heart. She and the family owned Clingman's Market on Washington Street in Lewisburg, now occupied by Stardust Café. Mrs. Clingman was best known for providing free meals to the students of Greenbrier Military School, Greenbrier College for Women and later to WVSOM students, or to any one that needed a helping hand.

As Mrs. Clingman began to age, she often wondered, "who will feed my people"? After she passed away, the Shepherd's Center of Greenbrier Valley began a program providing nutritious meals to sick and homebound individuals in the Greenbrier Valley. This program began in 2003 and is honorably named "Gwen's Meals".

The Shepherd's Center solicited area churches to prepare the meals and Old Stone was blessed to have two new church members, Homer and Arlen Myers, who took on the challenge. They initially delivered 35 meals to individuals, but their love of cooking led them to preparing the meals. They chose a menu of pork roast with gravy, noodles, green beans, roll and dessert. Betty Dempsey was also on their "kitchen crew" for many years.

After many years and Homer's passing, Arlen remained steadfast to honor him. Up until this year, she was still purchasing the food, cooking the roasts and organizing her "kitchen crew" for 60 individuals. However, she too has decided to pass the torch after 19 years and will be relocating to Illinois.

So it is with deep gratitude, Arlen, we say "thank you" for representing Old Stone/Gwen's Meals program in such an exemplary manner. We wish you nothing but the best!
