# A New Year, A New Beginning?

What habits have we developed over the years? What habits would we like to develop this new year?

It may take longer than 66 days, but as we continue along with this transitional chapter, we are encouraged at the new habits taking shape, the results beginning to show, and the hope of a new tomorrow forming before our very eyes.

## Session Highlights - December 1, 2021 Stated Meeting:

The Session of OSPC met for their regular Stated meeting on Wednesday, December 1. Nine Elders were in attendance, along with the Moderator, Rev. Jeff Binder; Clerk, Nancy Smallenberger and Educator/Program Coordinator, Amy Kesterson.

A report was given on the recent meeting of the Reopening Task Force. At this time the Session formally approved the creation of the Task Force. It was also agreed to accept the Task Force recommendations to continue with the current guidelines - to encourage mask wearing, social distancing when possible, no meals and using individual prepackaged communion elements.

The Session heard a report from the Nominating Committee and have called a Congregational Meeting to be held immediately after the morning worship service on Sunday, December 19, to elect Elders, Class of 2024; Trustees, Class of 2024, and individuals to serve on the 2022 Nominating Committee.

Financial reports had been included in the Session information emailed prior to the meeting. Committee moderators were reminded that they needed to submit their budget requests for 2022 so that the Stewardship/Finance committee could begin working on the 2022 budget.

It was announced by the Personnel committee that Brennan Wood has accepted the position of Director of Music.

The next Stated meeting will be Wednesday, January 5, 2022.

### **Reopening Task Force:**

Old Stone's Session recently appointed a Reopening Task Force for the purpose of making recommendations to the Session on when and how to safely reopen church activities as the pandemic continues to evolve. The Reopening Task Force met on November 18, 2021. Bill Cunningham, Polly Cunningham, Craig Boisvert, Nancy Greenstreet, Amy Kesterson, Molly McMillion, Andy Kelso, Amy Meadows, Jen Runyon, and Rev. Jeff Binder were present. Several others could not attend.

Using the current guidelines instituted by the Session regarding church participation during the pandemic, the group decided that we would continue to evaluate the effectiveness of these decisions and to use the Center for Disease Control tracker guidelines to make recommendations for our session.

Reviewing the status of the pandemic this week, it was reported that all counties in WV, including Greenbrier, are in the red zone or High for community transmission, based upon percent positivity (those testing positive to Covid) and number of cases. Only 34.8% of the total population in Greenbrier County is fully vaccinated including children under 12 years of age. Only 57.3 % of the total population greater than 65 years is fully vaccinated. Although county statistics show a slight trend toward fewer cases and with county deaths currently suppressed, cases are showing an increase nationwide (up 16.1% from the previous week). Therefore, we must all still maintain recommended guidelines to protect our church family and community. No guidelines are mandated for church activities that include worship service, children's activities, and groups using our church, but the task force recommends that eveyone should continue to wear masks inside church buildings and social distancing guidelines be followed. The task force recommends we continue the current policy of not having events with food or drink until the time of lower community transmission status occurs.

The task force is deeply appreciative of all efforts by our membership to adhere to these guidelines during this long period of pandemic time and encourages all members to immediately get immunized and boostered if available, to wear masks, to social distance, and pray for patience while we continue to endure this pandemic so that we can safely and eventually seek the normalcy we all miss in practicing our faith.
