#### July 18th - Maureen Wright

Maureen is the Stated Clerk and Associate for Congregational Support. The Stated Clerk focuses on records, annual record reviews, stated and called meetings of Presbytery, parliamentary procedure, judicial process, policies, Presbytery Trustees, and the Book of Order. The Associate for Congregational Support helps congregations to be effective in ministry and mission, especially assisting small churches to inspire hope, generate vision, and discover new models for ministry. ## July 25th - Rev. Malcolm Brownlee

Malcolm Brownlee holds degrees from Washington and Lee University, Union Presbyterian Seminary, Yale Divinity School, and Columbia Theological Seminary. From 1973 till 1984 he taught Christian ethics at two theological seminaries in



Indonesia. In 2004 till 2006 he was Interim Quadrant Pastor in the part of West Virginia Presbytery that includes Lewisburg. He spends a lot of time gardening, preaches occasionally, is a consultant in strategic planning for churches, and serves on the boards of his local United Way and his local community development organization.

#### **News from the Interim PNC:**

The search for an interim pastor has begun and the Committee wanted to provide an update and an inside view of the process to the congregation.

The Interim Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) consists of 5 members who were selected by the Session. The members are Andy Kelso, Tracy Morgan, Jim Coleman, Sharon Rowe and me. David Lee, our Presbytery Committee on Ministry liaison and Session Moderator, is working with the Committee and we have also met with the General Presbyter, Ed Thompson.

We began the process two months ago by completing a Ministry Information Form. This form includes information about Old Stone and its programs. Fortunately, this process moved along very quickly and received approval from both the Session and the Committee on Ministry. It was then posted on the Church Leadership Connection website, a national exchange through the Presbyterian Church USA that matches potential candidates with churches, based on the qualifications both are seeking.

We have now begun reviewing the initial batch of potential applicants and will be meeting weekly to keep the process moving as quickly as possible. I believe I can speak for all the committee members when I say we very much want to expedite the process but be thoughtful in recruiting the best possible candidate to lead us as we search for an installed pastor.

Please know that because of the confidential nature of this search we are not able to give too many specifics, but if you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to reach out to me or anyone on the Committee.




