Dear Friends,

This letter is on behalf of Friends of Bluestone, Inc. and presbytery's Bluestone Committee to the Sessions and Congregations of the Presbytery of West Virginia.

In November this past year Bluestone was advised by the WVDHHR Office of Environmental Health Services that our potable water storage tank is in need of maintenance and refurbishment. This news came as the result of their Sanitary Survey which was conducted earlier in October.

The Bluestone Committee met in January and approved a budget that projects \$30,000 of expenditure for repairs to the storage tank. The budget also projects another \$30,000 for deferred maintenance and repairs to our swimming pool filtration facility.

Friends of Bluestone, Inc. normally works to achieve an Annual Fund Goal of at least \$45,000. The bar is being raised to \$60,000 this year in hope that they can raise an additional amount and help camp avoid taking on any more debt than it has to.

Over the years, Bluestone has received special project grants from individual churches at times when there was significant need to fund major repair or improvement at camp. Though we are prepared to take on additional debt via our line of credit with the presbytery (Mission Development Fund) we wanted to advise churches of the work to be done and state simply that Bluestone could use some extra financial support this year.

We ask that you present this letter to your church leadership for consideration. If you'd like more specific project details or have questions, please do not hesitate to call or email me. Thanks very much for your attention to this request.

# Session Highlights - Stated Session Meeting (Wednesday, February 15, 2023):

The Session held their February Stated meeting on Wednesday, February 15th, at the church and via Zoom. The meeting was called to order by Rev. Jeff Binder and opened with devotions and prayer by the clerk, Nancy Smallenberger.

In attendance were: Moderator, Rev. Cameron Harkness, representing the Bereavement group.

Minutes from the January 18th Stated Session meeting were presented by the Clerk and were approved as presented.

Rev. Binder welcomed Rev. Cam Harkness who was present to update the Session on the Bereavement group. A motion was made, seconded and APPROVED to grant Harkness "the floor".

Committees/groups who presented items for action, and those actions, included:

#### BUILDING USE POLICY UPDATE TASK FORCE

- APPROVED a request from the Lewisburg Garden Club to meet at the church on Wednesday, March 22.
- APPROVED a request for the ALP/CP program of the Presbytery of WV to meet at Old Stone on May 19 and 20 and also on October 13 and 14.
- APPROVED a request from the Daughters of the American Revolution to use fellowship hall on March 16, April 20 and May 18.
- DENIED a request from Goodladd Dog Training to hold workshops at Old Stone.

### BUILDING USE SURVEY - Amy Kesterson

• Session APPROVED for the survey to be presented at the Congregational Meeting on Sunday, February 26.

### WORSHIP and MUSIC – Townley Hamilton

• Townley reported that the committee has discussed ways to increase attendance for the Maundy Thursday service. One of the suggestions was to offer a meal for those attending prior to the service. A motion was made, seconded and APPROVED to have a meal prior to the service. The idea is for those attending to gather in fellowship hall for a meal, followed by the service, also to be held in fellowship hall. Those planning to attend will be encouraged to RSVP to the church office in order to plan the meal.

#### STEWARDSHIP and FINANCE – Jennifer Runyon

• The Stewardship Committee presented the 2023 proposed budget for Session's approval. There was much discussion and many questions regarding the proposed budget. There was a question concerning a line item under Personnel that prompted a motion being made to move that amount from Personnel to Music. The motion was seconded and APPROVED. Also, during discussion, a motion was made and seconded regarding staff salaries. Following questions and further discussion, the motion was WITHDRAWN. Once all questions were answered and there being no further discussion, a motion was made and seconded to approve the budget as presented, with the one change; the motion was then APPROVED. A motion was then made, seconded and APPROVED to present the budget to the congregation during the Congregational meeting on Sunday, February 26.

#### PASTOR'S REPORT – Rev. Binder

#### REPORT OF THE CLERK – Nancy Smallenberger

• The 2022 Statistical Report, which had been completed by the Clerk, was presented prior to being submitted to the Presbytery office. A motion and seconded to affirm the report as presented and was APPROVED.

The Sesson's next meeting will be Wednesday, March 15, 2023, at 6:00 p.m.

There being no other business that required Session's action, the meeting was adjourned and closed with prayer by Rev. Binder.
