A Note from Rev. Julie Olt:

Dear Friends,

What a wonderful welcome you have given Schuyler and me to Old Stone Presbyterian Church and to Lewisburg. Thank you so much for all your efforts to include us, they are greatly appreciated!

I've been thinking about you all as I try to learn your names (please be patient with me...) and that has gotten me to thinking about names.

Research has shown that one of the most beautiful sounds we hear is someone saying our name. Even if we don't particularly like our name, we like to hear it said. It affirms us and grounds us and helps us to feel like we belong. It also makes us feel like someone cares about us if they take the time to learn, know, and use our name. I love it when Sky calls me by name. I love it now that my grandchildren are all old enough to call me "Minnie" at last! They know that I have a name.

In the Gospel of John, chapter 20, verses 11-18 we read one of the most beautiful stories in the Bible. It is usually read as an Easter text, but I've been thinking about it since arriving here. And the reason I have been thinking about it is because Mary is weeping at the empty tomb and doesn't recognize that the person she thinks is the gardener is actually Jesus. However, when he *calls her by name*, her weeping turns to joy as she realizes who is talking to her.

Jesus knows each of us by name, and calls to us. It is up to us to recognize his voice and to follow him. With all the name calling that goes on in our society today, it isn't always easy to hear our true name and to hear the true name of others. We sometimes forget that we, and others, are children of God who have a name that is called by our Shepherd. When we call other people names that label them, demean them, and are something other than their given name, we dishonor them, and we dishonor our call from Christ to love one another.

What would happen if today you called someone by their name? Your spouse, your child, the checkout person at Walmart, your waitress? I think that the world might just be a gentler, kinder place if we call people by their names. Perhaps someone needs, like Mary at the tomb, for their weeping to be turned to joy and you calling them by name might just help.

Remembering Chuck Lewis – by Jim Arbuckle:

On May 2, 2022, I contacted Rev. Jeff Binder explaining the reason I had not been to church, due to complications from a fall in August 2021.

Two nights later on May 4, 2022, I a saw light blinking on our answering machine. Pressing the button, I heard this familiar and friendly voice saying, "Jim, this is Chuck Lewis. I just heard and I am very sorry about your accident. I was just wondering if there is anything I can do. You can call me at 667-2---. Thank-you. Good-bye."

I immediately called him back and thanked him, and told him that I was doing okay, and ask how he was doing. He told me that he was alright, but his concern was for me, and again asked if there was anything that he could do, to please tell him. Here was a man, who was suffering health problems far more than I had ever suffered in my life, yet his only concern was the help for a fellow church member and I'm sure other church members as well.

We talked for a long time that night. He invited me to his Sunday school class over Zoom. We talked about which different Bible translations we enjoyed. We also talked about how many cars and trucks I had bought from Bill Lewis Motors in my lifetime. We even talked about attending kindergarten together at St. James Episcopal Church. Before this nice phone call ended, we agreed to do some phone discussion on what the Bible says about the Book of Life and Eternal Life.

Unfortunately, we never got to have that important discussion. I know that I need not tell anyone what a kind and Christian man Chuck Lewis was, but I just wanted to share this time with you. And today, I still have his caring voice on our answering machine.

Scam Emails/Phone Calls Reminder:

This is a reminder to be diligent and watch out for scammers pretending to be the staff of Old Stone Presbyterian Church or of the Presbytery of WV.

In the recent past, a number of people received a phishing email from Gmail accounts pretending to be the General Presbyter or the Stated Clerk of the Presbytery of WV. The email did not come from an account ending in "wvpresbytery.org".

If you receive an email or phone call similar to this, DO NOT send the requested gift cards, money, or personal information. Old Stone Presbyterian Church and the Presbytery of WV will NEVER ask you for gift cards, money, or personal information. Please reach out to a staff member if you receive email requests such as this and would like to verify whether or not it is a scam.
