Leadership Changes During an Interim:

What does healthy leadership look like within a Christian community? We read of an idealization of such living in the fourth chapter of the book of Acts:

32 Now the whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one claimed private ownership of any possessions, but everything they owned was held in common. 33 With great power the



apostles gave their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all. 34 There was not a needy person among them, for as many as owned lands or houses sold them and brought the proceeds of what was sold. 35 They laid it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to each as any had need. (Acts 4:32-35)

Admittedly, this type of living is hard to do in today's society; there are many structures in place that hinder such a community. Over the years, Presbyterians have adjusted their leadership styles to better pair the ideals of the church with contemporary cultures. And what started it all off? Theologian John Calvin celebrated a word from the biblical Greek: presbyteros, meaning "elder," from which we get our Presbyterian name, and from which can in turn be understood to mean "rule of elders."

Old Stone Presbyterian Church is organized to be led by the elders of the church, or the session, but they do not lead all by themselves. Over the years, Presbyterians have evolved to form wonderful relationships of leadership between elders, pastors, staff, and members, so that the biblical ideals of caring for each and every child of God can be realized today, inspired by those days of the Early Church.

During this transitional chapter in the life of Old Stone, we have a unique opportunity to re-frame how we understand leadership for the church moving forward once again, just as churches have done for generations. How is the church being called to be the hands and feet of Christ in the world today? And what type of leaders are needed moving forward? How can our structure of committees be more responsive to the needs of this community, both within and outside the walls of the church? What qualities are important in the next pastor or with our staff to partner with us in leadership ahead? How can our members and friends identify and embrace the God-given gifts for leadership within each and every one of us?

Session Highlights - April 12, 2022 Stated Meeting:

The Session of OSPC met on Wednesday, April 12. Six elders were in attendance. Rev. Jeff Binder opened the meeting with scripture and prayer.

Two sets of minutes were presented for Session approval, including:

The following action items, requiring Session approval, were presented and approved:

- Christian Education committee recommended that the Sunday morning nursery be open only the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month (due to lack of children attending); closing the nursery during the summer (June-September) with the nursery being available on holidays. The committee will continue to search for volunteers to assist with the nursery.
- Worship and Music committee presented the 2022 schedule for the celebration of the Lord's Supper along with any additional home communion celebrations.
- Reopening Task Force following discussion of the newest recommendations, the Session approved to do away with the "Yellow" category and go with "Green" and "Red" in regards to worship services and activities in the building.
- Jennifer Runyon was elected to serve as Ruling Elder Commission for the upcoming Presbytery meeting on Thursday, May 19, at the Beckley Presbyterian Church.
- Adding eight names back to the Active Roll that had previously been moved to Inactive Roll, per the individual's request.

The Session's next meeting will be Wednesday, May 18, 2022, at 6:00 p.m., in the Activities Room.

Center for Rural & Community Health - WVSOM:

The Center for Rural & Community Health (CRCH) recently started a new program in partnership with Mountain Transit Authority through a grant provided by the WV Department of Health & Human Resources.

This program provides **free transportation** for Greenbrier County residents over the age of 18 or accompanied by a legal guardian to any **non-emergency medical appointment**. We ask that folks give us a call a week in advance of their medical appointment to schedule their ride.
