What: Women's Fall Social Gathering


Who: Granddaughters of All Ages, regardless of Circle

Stewardship - A Note from the Moderator

"Then another man spoke up and said, 'Lord, I'll follow You, but first I must take care of my aged father and bury him when he dies.' But Jesus said to him, 'Now is the time to follow Me, and let those who are dead bury their own dead.'" - Matthew 8:21-22, The Passion Translation

This is a September like none that the Old Stone Presbyterian Church has ever seen, despite its long and strong history. With a pandemic still shaking its angry fist over our town, our state and our world, and with leadership of the church in a time of uncertainty and transition, we are trying to be the faithful Church in a time with a lot more questions than answers.

And as many long-time church people know, autumn is Stewardship season. This is the time when we prayerfully reflect and faithfully invest ourselves in the ministry and mission of our common life as a congregation. In a time with so much unknown, it is completely understandable that we are tempted to sit back and wait to see how all this plays out before we commit. But I believe that this passage from Matthew's Gospel points out a still better way: **now** is the time to commit. Now is the time to step out in trust, pledging not only our treasure but our talents and our most important gift, our time. Like the disciples who walked with Jesus, we have no clear map of where all of this is going to lead. But the future belonged to those who followed Jesus into it. No one remembers the names of those who turned back... it was those who followed Him without answers who became those who changed the world.

So my hope is that you will prayerfully ask, "How can I best support and encourage what God is doing in and through this church? What talent do I have hidden away that needs brushed off and shared? Who needs my special skills or loving attention? What have I been holding on to, waiting to see, when NOW is the time for me to invest it in faith?" And the God who is faithful and true in all things will receive those gifts gladly and bless them, and make them a blessing that brings God glory and joy.
